# **Papuff**

The Papuff is a stash decreasing project. You need quite a lot of yarn and you can use all your leftover yarns for it. For my Papuffs I used 7 to 13 strands of yarn together. The Papuff is worked in two pieces, you need one flat circle for the bottom and one for the top.



#### **Materials:**

At least 500 g yarn, the more the better. I recommend a meterage of at least 200 m. Old cushions or clothes for stuffing. Hook size 10 mm.

#### Gauge:

You really don't need a gauge for the Papuff. Just find out how many strands of your yarn will be the most comfortable for you to use with a size 10 mm hook.

#### Work the bottom:

Close every round with a slip stitch. Make a chain stitch.

Foundation row: Ch 2. 6 sc in the second chain from hook.

Row 2: Increase (inc) around (12 st).

Row 3: Sc 1, inc (18 st).

Row 4: Sc 2, inc (24 st).

Row 5: Sc 3, inc (30 st).

Row 6: Sc 4, inc (36 st).

Row 7: Sc 5, inc (42 st).

Row 8: Sc 6, inc (48 st).

Row 9: Sc 7, inc (54 st).

Row 10: Sc 8, inc (60 st).

Row 11: Sc 9, inc (66 st).

Row 12: Sc 10, inc (72 st).

Row 13: Sc 11, inc (78 st).

Row 14: Sc 12, inc (84 st).

Row 15: Sc 13, inc (90 st).

Work this way until you reach the desired diameter or until you have at least 2/3 yarn left over. Fasten off and weave in ends.

### Top:

Work the top of the Papuff in the same way as the bottom until the top has the same diameter and stitches in round.

Work one row sc in back loops only. Then work in plain sc as many rows as you want for desired height or until you run almost out of yarn. Do not fasten off!

## Attach top to bottom:

Put the top on the bottom and use the slip stitch to crochet both parts together. If you don't have enough yarn for one more round I recommend to sew the top to the bottom. Leave an opening wide enough for the stuffing. Use enough stuffing so that the finished Papuff keep in shape. Close the opening with slip stitch or sew it together. Fasten off and weave in ends.
